

The Inspector (1965-1969)

These shorts were produced for movie theaters, but were later shown on TV as part of *The Pink Panther Show* in 1969-1970. The theme music, "A Shot in the Dark," was composed by Henry Mancini for a feature film of the same name.

Episodes

01 The Great De Gaulle Stone Operation December 21, 1965

The Inspector protects the famous DeGaulle diamond from the 3-headed Matzoreilly Brothers.

02 Reaux, Reaux, Reaux Your Boat February 1, 1966

The Inspector chases the notorious smuggler, "Captain Clamity", and his first mate, "Crab Louie".

03 Napoleon Blown-Aparte February 2, 1966

The Inspector tries to protect the Commissioner from the "Mad Bomber", who has escaped prison.

04 Cirrhosis of the Louvre March 9, 1966

The Inspector thwarts an art thief, "The Blotch", who plans to steal all the paintings from the Louvre.

05 Plastered in Paris April 5, 1966

The Inspector chases a fugitive known as "X" around the world.

06 Cock-A-Doodle Deux Deux June 15, 1966

The "Plymouth Rock," largest diamond in the world has been stolen and the suspects are all chickens.

07 Ape Suzette June 24, 1966

The Inspector wants to fight a small sailor, but instead faces a giant ape.

08 The Pique Poquette of Paris August 25, 1966

The Inspector tries to arrest "Spider Pierre", an expert pickpocket.

09 Sicque! Sicque! Sicque! September 23, 1966

When the Inspector investigates a mad scientist, Sergeant Deux Deux accidently drinks a secret formula and transforms into a Mr. Hyde-like creature.



10 That's No Lady, That's Notre Dame October 26, 1966

The Inspector, disguised as a woman, and the Commissioner set up a sting operation to catch a purse thief. But Commissioner's wife becomes jealous.

11 Unsafe and Seine November 9, 1966

The Inspector and Deux-Deux search for a secret agent across the globe.

12 Toulouse La Trick December 30, 1966

The Inspector handcuffs himself to "Toulouse le Moose" to prevent him from escaping.

13 Sacré Bleu Cross February 1, 1967

Deux-Deux gives the Inspector an unlucky rabbit's foot in their chase after "Hassan the Assassin."

14 Le Quiet Squad May 17, 1967

The Inspector looks after an overworked and overstressed Commissioner, but has trouble with a noisy cat.

15 Bomb Voyage May 22, 1967 Robert McKimson

The Inspector rescues the Commissioner, who has been kidnapped by extraterrestrials.

16 Le Pig-Al Patrol May 24, 1967

The Inspector tries to arrest "Pig Al" and his biker gang.

17 Le Bowser Bagger May 30, 1967

The Inspector uses a hunting dog, "Private Bowser", to track down a thief.

18 Le Escape Goat June 29, 1967

"Louie le Finke" escapes. The Inspector is fired.



19 Le Cop on Le Rocks July 3, 1967

The Inspector mistaken for a bank robber who looks exactly like him and ends up in jail.

20 Crow De Guerre August 16, 1967

A crow keeps stealing jewels from the Inspector.

21 Canadian Can-Can September 20, 1967

The Inspector chases "Two-Faced Harry" through Canada.

22 Tour de Farce October 25, 1967

The Inspector is stranded on a deserted island with dangerous convict "Mack le Truck".

23 The Shooting of Caribou Lou December 20, 1967

Again in Canada, the Inspector is kidnapped by the fur trapper, "Caribou Lou".

24 London Derriere February 7, 1968

The Inspector has chased international jewel thief, "Louie le Swipe," all around Europe, and end up in London.

25 Les Miserobots March 21, 1968

The Inspector is fired and being replaced by a police robot.

26 Transylvania Mania March 26, 1968

The Inspector discovers Dracula is making monsters without a license.

27 Bear De Guerre April 26, 1968

The Inspector goes quail hunting and runs into a bear.



28 Cherche Le Phantom June 13, 1968

The Inspector hunts for an escaped gorilla from the Paris Zoo and a phantom hiding in the opera house.

29 Le Great Dane Robbery July 7, 1968

The Inspector faces a vicious dog named Tiny while looking for a stolen code cipher.

30 Le Ball and Chain Gang July 24, 1968

The Inspector must deal with an argumentative couple named Charlie and Edna.

31 La Feet's Defeat July 24, 1968

The Commissioner sends the Inspector and Deux-Deux to capture "Muddy la Feet."

32 French Freud January 22, 1969

The Inspector protects the Du Barry diamond from a pair of thieves, "Melody Mercurochrome" and her maid/husband.

33 Pierre and Cottage Cheese February 26, 1969

The Inspector tries to capture "Dirty Pierre le Punk" with the help of a robot named "Charlie."

34 Carte Blanché May 14, 1969

The Inspector accidentally steals a shopping cart from his local supermarket and tries to get rid of it before he is caught.
