BILL AND TED'S EXCELLENT ADVENTURE

Their banter drives me mad and their care-free naivety often makes me want to puke but I most seriously believe that Bill (Winter) and Ted (Reeves) are the freshest thing to happen to fantasy filmmaking in decades. They're the kind of guys you'd roll out with for a quick flip around a fun fair or take on a trip to visit obnoxious aunt Molly. The film's not bad either.

In the beginning, you're as much in the dark as heap.

Soon, they're whizzing through time, and picking up historical figures such as Napoleon, Billy The Kid and Socrates, who'll come in handy during the verbal and whose opinions on the present will certainly add a wild flavour to that report.

Things start to go wrong when Napoleon hitchhikes to the future and is looked after, and lost, by Ted's little brother. Eventually, all the time personages end up in jail, and Bill and Ted must get them out not just to pass their test but also - surprise. surprise — to save the future of humanity.

Wickedly funny, if plainly preposterous, Bill And Ted's Excellent Adventure exhibits all that's good and fun about independent filmmaking. It's good, clean, family fun (apart from Bill's occasional references to his slight Oedipus complex), which makes a change from much of the material I have to slip through my slot every month.
